Included with this letter is documentation concerning the difficulty I have experienced in the renewal of my license. The USPAP attempts to develop professional standards and integrity is failing miserably in my case. I have met all the requirements since the inception of licensing in 1990, both on [DELETION] and Florida. Having appraised all types of real estate with values in the millions for over thirty five years, there is little continuing education offers me. I have currently met the intent of the law, as a matter of fact I completed 94 hours of continuing education in less than a year. Needless to say it has cost me over a thousand dollars. Yet the Florida Department of Business and Professional Regulation refuses to credit me for the renewal. In my opinion they are interpreting the law erroneously forcing me to take 30 more hours at a considerable expense in loss of work time.

Please note the letter of December 13, 2004 which they apply to me. The IDECC certified course does not apply, as I am not going to Florida, that is transferring from one State to another. I have held the Certified General REA license simultaneous in both states for ten years. To force me to take excessive continuing education I am sure is not the intent of the Appraisal Foundation.

If you review the documents and can understand what I have experienced, you will see my feelings about this matter. I hope the Foundation can do something about this situation. I do not have an overabundance of confidence in the Florida determination of the intent of the Appraisal Foundation. Hopefully I am wrong.
