Last December 17, 2001 several appraisers in Puerto Rico received from [DELETION] and on behalf of the U. S. Department of Labor, a request for a "fee quote" to appraise a property in Aguadilla, Puerto Rico, which will be bought by the U. S. Department of Labor in Puerto Rico.

Among their requirements, the appraisers must have an MAJ designation. On January 8, 2002 we wrote to [DELETION], Director of R. E. Services for [DELETION], explaining her that such requirement was discriminatory and against the FIRREA law.
