The ASC considered the preliminary results of the Review and the State's response to those results. The Program has been awarded an ASC Finding of "Good." Rhode Island will remain on a two-year Review Cycle. An area of concern that was identified is being addressed by the Program. The final ASC Compliance Review Report (Report) is attached.
