RE: ASC Compliance Review of North Dakota's Appraisal Management Company (AMC) Regulatory Program

Dear Jodie Campbell:

The Appraisal Subcommittee (ASC) staff conducted an ASC Compliance Review (Review) of the North Dakota AMC regulatory program (AMC Program) on May 23-25, 2023, to determine the AMC Program's compliance with Title XI of the Financial Institutions Reform, Recovery, and Enforcement Act of 1989.

The ASC considered the preliminary results of the Review and the State's response to those results. The AMC Program has been awarded an ASC Finding of "Good." The final ASC Compliance Review Report (Report) is attached.

The ASC identified the following area(s) of non-compliance:

- States must impose requirements on State-registered AMCs to provide written notice when removing appraisers from the appraiser panel consistent with the AMC Rule;¹
- States shall not require an appraisal management company that is a subsidiary owned and controlled by a financial institution regulated by a Federal financial institution regulatory agency to register with a State;² and
- States must enforce and document ownership limitations for State-registered AMCs.³

ASC staff will confirm that appropriate corrective actions have been taken during the next Review. North Dakota will remain on a two-year Review Cycle.
