RE: ASC Compliance Review of Louisiana's Appraiser Regulatory Program

Dear Summer Mire:

The Appraisal Subcommittee (ASC) staff conducted an ASC Compliance Review (Review) of the Louisiana appraiser regulatory program (Appraiser Program) on September 12-14, 2023, to determine the Program's compliance with Title XI of the Financial Institutions Reform, Recovery, and Enforcement Act of 1989.

The ASC considered the preliminary results of the Review and the State's response to those results. The Appraiser Program has been awarded an ASC Finding of "Good." The final ASC Compliance Review Report (Report) of the Louisiana Appraiser Program is attached.

The ASC identified the following area of non-compliance:

• States must resolve all complaints filed against appraisers within one year (12 months) of the complaint filing date in the absence of special documented circumstances.<sup>1</sup>

ASC staff will confirm that appropriate corrective actions have been taken during the next Review. Louisiana will remain on a two-year Review Cycle.
