Dear Mr. Weinberg:

I received your email of February 7, 2006. While I wrote my letter of November 4, 2005 to you at your old address of 1029 Vermont Ave., N.W., Ste. 9000, Washington, D.C. 20015, said letter was not returned to me. I must assume that it was forwarded to your new address.

Enclosed is an additional copy of my letter of November 4, 2005 to you.

In early 2001, I applied for an upgrade of my real estate appraisal license from Certified Residential to Certified General. You should note that I have been a real estate appraiser in California for over 30 years and had no disciplinary record at that time. The Acting Director of the California Office of Real Estate Appraisers, Anthony Majeski, was instrumental in using my request for a license upgrade as an excuse to start an administrative proceeding against me that resulted in the imposition of \$ 11,975.00 in costs against me and the imposition of \$ 3000.00 in fines against me. A public reproof was also imposed against me. All of this happened despite there being no complaints from the general public. I contacted Mrs. Tidwell of the Appraisal Subcommittee in 2001, shortly after these issues commenced and I hired lobbyist [DELETION] to speak with her, which he did. On March 15, 2005, I wrote to Mr. Danny Wiley of The Appraisal Subcommittee.

You should note that my research with respect to other states indicates that if an appraisal sample is submitted as part of an upgrade application and the appraisal sample is deemed inadequate by the licensing agency, that it is sent back to the appraiser seeking the upgrade and then he is asked to reapply.

As a result of OREA'S and Mr. Majeski's actions, I have lost numerous appraisal jobs, including some with city agencies. You should note that Mr. Majeski's actions have had a significant negative impact on my income. Moreover, my errors and omissions insurance carrier would not defend me in the matter because there were no public complaints.

You should note that I am African-American. I have also requested that OREA grant reconsideration to me in this matter. Mr. Majeski has not to date responded to my request for reconsideration.
