The Appraisal Subcommittee (ASC) staff conducted an ASC Compliance Review (Review) of Oklahoma's appraiser regulatory program on September 30-October 2, 2009. This is the final ASC Compliance Review Report (Report) on that Review.

The ASC has considered the staff's preliminary findings regarding the Review and the State's response. The ASC has determined that the Program is in substantial compliance with Title XI of the Financial Institutions, Reform, Recovery, and Enforcement Act of 1989, as amended (Title XI). However, the ASC did identify the following concerns:

• Oklahoma must maintain sufficient documentation to support that approved courses conform to AOB Criteria. 1

In the response, the State indicated it has taken corrective actions, which are detailed in the attached Report. During the next Review, ASC staff will confirm that these corrective actions have taken place and are appropriate. On December 7, 2009, the Board reported additional documentation was obtained from the course providers for three of the four courses identified in our Compliance Review. Based on the documentation received, two of the courses were verified to be properly approved; one course was deemed not suitable for appraisers and the approval was withdrawn. The approval for the fourth course identified in the Compliance Review was also withdrawn because the course provider failed to provide supporting documentation.  The Board also advised that the above courses were approved prior to the course review process change in October 2008. A checklist was developed and the review is now performed by Program staff with a recommendation to the Board regarding approval. Furthermore, Program staff is in the process of reviewing the documentation for all education files approved prior to October 2008 to ensure each file contains sufficient support for the Board's decision.
