The Appraisal Subcommittee (ASC) staff conducted an ASC Compliance Review (Review) of Connecticut's appraiser regulatory program (Program) on July 12-14, 2010. This is the final ASC Compliance Review Report (Report) on that Review.

The ASC has considered the preliminary findings regarding the Review and the State's response. The ASC has determined the Program is in substantial compliance with Title XI of the Financial Institutions Reform, Recovery, and Enforcement Act of 1989, as amended. In its response, the State indicated that corrective actions are in process to address the following area of concern identified by the ASC:

 States must adopt and/or implement all relevant AQB Real Property Appraiser Qualification Criteria.¹

Through off-site monitoring and during the next Review, ASC staff will confirm that the State's corrective actions as indicated were completed. Statute: \$512 does not require approval for instructors of appraisal education. Despite the conflicting provisions in the regulations and statute, ASC staff found no incidents where these provisions were applied to any aspect of the Program.	On September 20, 2010, the Commission reported to ASC staff the following: A public hearing was held on July 12, 2010 concerning proposed amendments to the regulations. The Attorney General's (AG) office will review the proposed amendments to ensure "legal sufficiency." Following the AG's approval, an affirmative vote by the Legislature's Regulation Review Committee (Committee) is required. The Commission believes the amendments will likely be approved at the Committee's September 28, 2010 meeting. The required statutory amendment has been drafted and will be filed during the next legislative session of the Connecticut General Assembly, which will convene on January 5, 2011.
