The final ASC Compliance Review Report required the Board to: (1) provide a written plan on how the Department and Board will revise its complaint process to address the State's significant backlog of outstanding complaints and facilitate more timely complaint disposition in the future; and (2) send quarterly complaint logs to ASC staff to allow monitoring of the Board's progress towards addressing this situation.	The Department made progress in resolving complaints more expeditiously during the last year. The number of complaints outstanding decreased 17%, from 603 to 500. The number outstanding for more than one year decreased by 15%, from 218 to 186. The Department implemented procedural changes as outlined in their written plan provided to the ASC on August 26, 2010. An additional attorney was assigned to help administer appraisal related complaints. Currently four full-time attorneys are dedicated to facilitating complaint dispositions. Initiatives started by Program leadership have improved the complaint investigation and resolution process. A new internal system allows for immediate transfer of case file materials to appropriate personnel in the main office as well as investigators located in field offices throughout the State.
