The Appraisal Subcommittee (ASC) staff conducted an ASC Compliance Review (Review) of the Texas appraiser regulatory program (Program) on May 16-18, 2012. This is the final ASC Compliance Review Report (Report) on that Review.

The ASC has considered the preliminary findings regarding the Review and the State's response. The ASC has determined the Program is not in substantial compliance with Title XI of the Financial Institutions Reform, Recovery, and Enforcement Act of 1989, as amended. The ASC identified the following area of non-compliance:

• Texas should resolve all complaints filed against appraisers within one year, except for special documented circumstances. I

ASC staff will confirm corrective actions have taken place and are appropriate through off-site monitoring and during the next Review. Texas will remain on a two-year Review Cycle.
