RE: ASC Compliance Review of Delaware's appraiser regulatory program

Dear Mr. Collins:

The Appraisal Subcommittee (ASC) staff conducted an ASC Compliance Review (Review) of the Delaware appraiser regulatory program (Program) on January 9-11, 2013. This is the final ASC Compliance Review Report (Report) on that Review.

The ASC has considered the preliminary findings regarding the Review and the State's response. The ASC has determined the Program is not in substantial compliance with Title XI of the Financial Institutions Reform, Recovery, and Enforcement Act of 1989, as amended. The ASC identified the following areas of non-compliance:

- States must complete the continuing education affidavit audit within 60 business days from the date the renewal credential was issued;¹
- States must ensure that qualifying education documentation submitted with an application for appraiser credential upgrade is consistent with AQB Real Property Appraiser Qualification Criteria;²
- States must ensure that appraiser experience logs conform to AQB Real Property Appraiser Qualification Criteria;³
- States must use a reliable means of validating appraiser experience claims on all initial applications for appraiser credentialing;⁴
- States must ensure appraiser continuing education courses are consistent with AQB Real Property Appraiser Qualification Criteria;⁵ and
- States should resolve all complaints filed against appraisers within one year, except for special documented circumstances.

ASC staff will confirm corrective actions have taken place and are appropriate through off-site monitoring, a follow-up review in approximately 3 months and during the next Review. Delaware will remain on a two-year Review Cycle.

This letter and the attached Report are public record and available on the ASC website in accordance with the Freedom of Information Act.

Applies when the number, seriousness, and/or repetitiveness of the Title XI, ASC Policy Statements and/or AQB Criteria violations warrant this finding.

Delaware regulation §2.5.6 lists as acceptable education "business course related to real estate appraisal." This was noted in the 2011 Compliance Review Report. • AQB Criteria does not permit the course instructor's preparation time for CE credit. Delaware regulation §2.5.7.1 allows CE credit for "teaching, including preparation time up to the number of hours spent teaching." This was noted in the 2011 Compliance Review Report. • AQB Criteria requires appraisers to complete 14 hours of CE for each year preceding the credential renewal and ASC Policy Statement 10 specifies that States accepting affidavits for the CE claimed must complete a CE audit within 60 days from the date of renewal. In addition, 11 cases, including 10 of the dated cases, were in the Attorney General's (AG) Office awaiting final disposition, the remaining 22 cases were in various stages of the disciplinary process.
