The Appraisal Subcommittee (ASC) staff conducted an ASC Compliance Review (Review) of the North Dakota appraiser regulatory program (Program) on June 23-25, 2014, to determine the Program's compliance with Title XI of the Financial Institutions Reform, Recovery, and Enforcement Act of 1989, as amended.

The ASC considered the preliminary results of the Review and the State's response to those results. The Program has been awarded an ASC Finding of "Good." The final ASC Compliance Review Report (Report) is attached.

The ASC identified the following area(s) of non-compliance:

- States must, at a minimum, adopt and/or implement all relevant AQB Criteria; and
- States must have a policy for issuing a reciprocal credential to an appraiser from another State under the conditions specified in Title XI. ²
