Dear Mr. Weinberg,

As of Thursday, December 6th the Arkansas Appraiser Licensing and Certification Board officially met and was briefed as to the context of (1) the telephone conference conducted last Tuesday, (2) your follow-up letter summarizing that conference, and (3) the results of our telephone contact with the remaining five named appraisers.

The information provided the Board members, as a result of our research, was that [redacted] and [redacted] had agreed to and signed a stipulated agreement granting an over stamp of their credential and [redacted] have submitted experience logs of ad valorem tax appraisal experience and [redacted] was non-committal.

Subsequent to the Board members considering the individual responses, it was their conclusion that the four had complied with an option afforded them and that you be advised of that fact. The Board also concluded, by an approved motion, that [redacted] be notified that pursuant to the ASC restrictive action on the National Registry as to the "unknown" designation regarding AQB compliance Registry that his certificate is being re-issued with an over stamp that states "*not eligible for federally related transactions*".

On behalf of the Arkansas Appraiser Licensing and Certification Board members, we trust this brings to a satisfactory conclusion the issue that has long plagued the questionable appraisal experience by ad valorem tax appraisers.
